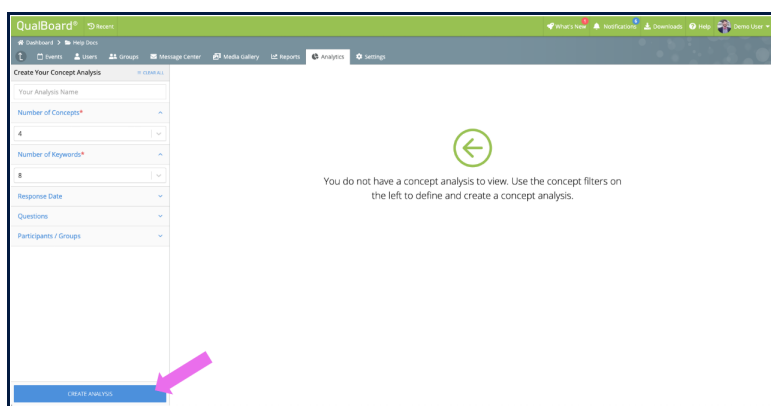


Generating a Concept Analysis

The Analytics feature will generate an analysis of the top concepts and sentiment around the responses that fall in that concept. To create a concept analysis, go to the Analytics tab, fill out the name of your Concept Analysis, and select how many concepts you would like. You may add additional filters to what data the analysis is run on, then, click "Create Analysis". (Note, your analysis must have a minimum of 250 text responses)



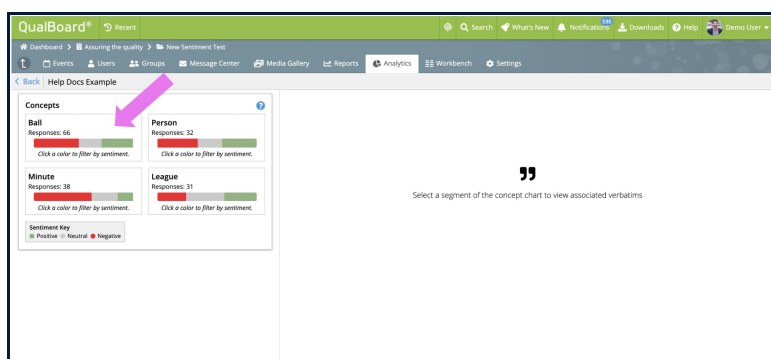

Petersson's goal stood as the lone score until early in the third, when he got the assist on Nikolay Goldenkov's goal to make it 2-0. This one is less spectacular, but it really does a lot to allay some fears that Petersson initially won't be able to keep up with the physicality of the NHL. The kid forced himself into position right in front of net with Calgary's 205-pound defender Travis Hynes—who had already been in a fight earlier—on his back. And when the puck found itself in front of him, he made the immediate and perfect decision to toss it over to Goldenkov for an easy finish. It was intelligent and assertive, and with the third goal coming moments later, it let the Canucks relax and earn the win.

But those are barriers that the league could easily move past if they really wanted to. The real reason Bettman keeps shoving his league into American frontiers even as recent expansion teams continue to struggle is that he desires new markets above all else. Pre-existing hockey fans in Quebec City, many of whom may already be spending their time and money on the Canadiens or Leafs, don't offer much in the way of expanding the game's reach. New hockey cities mean new fans and TV deals and, hopefully, lots of new money. This is a bet that Bettman has made over and over again during his tenure (Florida, Tampa Bay, Carolina, Anaheim, the list goes on), and the success of the Las Vegas Golden Knights—a trip to the Stanley Cup in their first season and solid attendance records—can only have emboldened him.

Marchand showed off his actual skill with a hat trick Monday against the Canucks in which all three goals came in the third period. His first was a solid backhand from the left circle, the third was an empty netter from mid ice. The second goal, however, was the real feat. Marchand cut across the mouth of the goal, and through the Canucks' shabby defense, carrying an opponent as he flicked in the puck at the last second. He looked like this right before he scored.

Left bobbing in the wake of Gary Bettman's endless American expansion drive and Philadelphia and Montreal's Red is a city full of hockey fans who remain desperate for a team to call their own. Some of those fans, like Joseph Maguire, who helps administer a Facebook page for Nordiques fans, remain hopeful that Quebec City can get a team, even after being spurned twice in the last three years. "Maybe Gary Bettman would take a vacation personally, but he didn't take it personally when Atlanta moved to Winnipeg," says Maguire. "I wouldn't rule out the possibility of Ottawa Senators becoming the Quebec Nordiques."

There are things the Lightning could have done, both now and for the near future. They might've added a right handed defenseman to a blue line that skews lefty. On another tack, they could have tried to find a way to alleviate their expanding cap crunch without getting worse on the ice. But, above all else, they could have gone after Simmonds, who would have been a do-it-all depth forward on this team, and, after seeing what Nashville got him for, would have come relatively cheaply. Simmonds is big, he's tough, he can score, he can work the boards, and he's a threat on the power play—there's really nothing not to like about his game, especially for a roster stacked enough where he'd fit in as a third- or fourth-line.
